## Editorial

As announced last year in our Editorial – and following the Call for contributions that has subsequently been published – the present issue of *Lexicon Philosophicum* includes a monographic section dedicated to the theme *Superstitio*, which has been edited by Claudio Buccolini and Enrico Pasini.

While *Lexicon Philosophicum* will continue to publish contributions freely submitted by scholars through the Journal online site (<https://l.cnr.it/lp-auth>), monographic sections will be increasingly included in the forthcoming issues. Some of them have already been planned. The first issue of next year will include a section dedicated to Cartesian metaphysics (*Des objections aux Objections. Le lexique de la métaphysique cartésienne*), edited again by Claudio Buccolini, whereas the following issue will include a monographic section dedicated to the theme *Simulatio* ('simulation'), which will be edited by Cristina Marras.

Recurring in 2024 the tricentenary of the birth of Immanuel Kant, Antonio Lamarra and Paola Rumore (University of Turin) are preparing a special issue of *Lexicon Philosophicum* entirely focused on textual and linguistic aspects of the great philosopher's writings. Scholars who wish to contribute to this issue are warmly encouraged to submit their papers by June 30, 2023.

Finally, for the two issues to be published in 2025, two monographic sections are envisaged respectively on *Terminus* ('term', in the logical and metaphysical sense), to be edited by Vincenzo De Risi and Enrico Pasini, and on *Praedestinatio* ('predestination'), to be edited by Massimiliano Lenzi.

As said, we strongly invite scholars in the history of philosophy, the history of ideas and conceptual history, and the history of scientific and medical thought, as well as intellectual historians engaged with the development of learned terminology, to submit their contributions to the Journal, both to the forthcoming special issues, and to the general section.
