

# LEXICON PHILOSOPHICUM

## EDITORIAL GUIDELINES

### General Rules

- use font Times New Roman, 12 pt for text and 11 pt for footnotes
- use Unicode system for non-Latin characters
- do not use any formatting (character, paragraph, style) nor hyphenation for the text
- footnote markers are to be placed after punctuation
- closing quotation marks are to be placed before punctuation
- use single quotation marks (") or italics to emphasize words
- use italics for foreign words and titles

### Quotations

- quotations within quotations: single quotation marks (')
- short quotations (<35 words): double quotation marks ("")
- long quotations (>35 words): separated from the text, preceded and followed by a line of space, in 11 pt body and without quotation marks
- additions and changes are to be placed in quotations between square brackets
- omissions in quotations are represented with ellipses between square brackets: [...]

n.b.:

- do not use bold type or highlight to emphasize, nor angle quotes («») to quotations

### Abbreviations

- use "*Ibid./ibid.*" for citation that refers to the same page or the same work as the previous citation
- use "ivi" (only for Italian texts) for citation that refers to the same work as the previous citation
- use "Id./Ead." for citation that refers to the same Author as the previous citation

n.b.:

- do not use "*art. cit., op. cit.*"
- the list of acronyms and abbreviations must be included in a specific section before the bibliography

### Citations

- use the Author/date system (surname year: page number/s)
- citations are to be placed in the footnotes
- multiple citations are separated by a semicolon<sup>1</sup>

### Bibliographical References

Use the standards from the examples below:

- Book:

Adams, R. M. 1994. *Leibniz. Determinist, Theist, Idealist*, New York & Oxford, Oxford University Press.

- Edited volume:

Leddy, N. and Lifschitz, A. (eds.) 2009. *Epicurus in the Enlightenment*, Oxford, Voltaire Foundation.

- Volume chapter:

Lifschitz, A. 2009. "The Enlightenment Revival of the Epicurean History of Language and Civilization", in *Epicurus in the Enlightenment*, ed. by N. Leddy and A. Lifschitz, Oxford, Voltaire Foundation, pp. 207-226.

n.b.:

- multiple works by the same Author must be in ascending chronological order and the Author's surname must be repeated (do not omit or replace with a dash, Id., or other). Add a lowercase letter for works of the same Author and the same year (e.g. Rossi 1988a, Rossi 1988b)
- page ranges are always given in full (pp. 560-574)
- names of cities and of publishers must be separated by "&"
- names of Authors must be separated by "and"
- book series must be indicated after the place of publication, in round brackets and between double quotation marks, with the Arabic number of the volume
- English titles should be in capital letters
- names of cities should be in the language of the country they belong to (Roma, London, Paris, Leiden)
- the language of the bibliographic entry should be that of the title to which it refers (a cura di/ed. by/éd. par/hrsg. von)

### **Tables and Figures**

- in .jpg or .png format
- numbered progressively and accompanied by appropriate captions
- provided with a separate file for the indication of the position in the text
- if protected by copyright, an authorization by the copyright holder must be provided

### **Abstract/Double Abstract**

- English papers must include an English abstract; papers in a language other than English must include an Abstract in English and one in the language of the paper
- for Notes & Discussions, only an English abstract is required, regardless of the language

### **Keywords**

- papers must include 5 keywords in English, separated by a semicolon

### **Acknowledgements, Research Funding**

- include any acknowledgements and research funding in a separate section before the bibliography
- in this section, the Author must disclose whether any AI tool beyond simple linguistic correction was used for writing, producing images or graphical elements of the paper, or in the collection and analysis of data. The Author must disclose which parts of the paper were produced by an AI tool, and which tool was used

### **Personal Data**

- when submitting the paper, also submit in a separate document the Author's name and surname, the title of the paper, affiliation, email address, and ORCID number if available
